Student Email

Students, please ensure that you check your email at least twice a week. Email is a primary way for many to communicate. To get to your school email, you will log on to your Clever Portal and select the Office 365 application. From there, you can check and respond to important information and review school announcements that are sent to all students and families.



The **ACT** will be given to all 11th grade students on Tuesday, October 31 and Tuesday, March 26 during the school day. (This will be paper based testing.) The **SAT** will be given to all 11th grade students in March, 2024 during the school day. This will be computer based and specific testing dates will be set closer to the time.

Students don't need to register for these assessments and there will be no charge. More information will be sent out closer to each testing date.

Florida Civics Literacy Exam (FCLE)

Beginning with students initially entering a Florida College System institution or state university in the 2021-2022 school year and thereafter, each student must demonstrate competency in civic literacy by achieving a passing score on an assessment and by successfully completing a civic literacy course. s 1007.25(5)(b). Florida Public School Districts are offering the opportunity for students to meet the assessment portion of this post-secondary requirement prior to their Florida college system entry.

12th grade students will be scheduled to take the Florida Civics Literacy Exam (FCLE) on Thursday, November 9. Students and parents will receive an email with the testing room location and testing time and this information will be posted outside Media.

This exam consists of approximately 80 multiple choice questions and is one 160-minute session. To learn more about this exam, please visit the FLDOE website at

ational SAT/ACT Testing Dates

Students can register through College Board (<u>www.collegeboard.com</u>) and ACT (<u>www.act.org</u>) to take these tests on a Sat. National Testing Date. **SAT** – November 4, December 2, March 9, May 4, and June 1

ACT – December 9, February 10, April 13, June 8, July 13

ACT School Day

The ACT will be given to all 11th grade students on Tuesday, October 31 during the school day. Testing room location information, as well as a letter with a student code for students to send their scores to colleges, will be sent to students and parents this week.

Students should bring pencils, a calculator, and snacks on testing day. The approved calculator information is attached. Students will be testing until about 11:45am then will go to 2nd lunch and will attend regular period 6 and 7 classes. This day will be straight 7 schedule.

Advanced Placement Exams

Students who are currently enrolled in an Advanced Placement course must register for the exam through a College Board online process. All students are required to take the AP exam for the AP courses in which they are enrolled. If students have not yet signed up for AP Classroom (for the exam order), please contact their teacher for the course Join Code. Students can call College Board at 888-225-5427 if they have any issues logging into their College Board account to complete this exam order process. The exam order deadline is November 15.
